Quality and Impact

Professor Zhang's research has shaped health policy across multiple jurisdictions, with 27 published papers cited in 49 policy and government documents — representing 33 organisations across more than eight countries — as indexed by Overton. In the United States, her Medicare Part D research has been cited repeatedly by the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission (MedPAC) in its annual reports to Congress and by the US Department of Health and Human Services in Federal Register rulemaking notices for the Affordable Care Act (2022–2024). Her work on concurrent opioid and benzodiazepine prescribing (co-authored with Hernandez et al., JAMA Network Open, 2018) was cited in the 2022 CDC Clinical Practice Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Pain — a landmark federal guideline covering millions of US prescribers — and by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) and seven US state governments. Internationally, her research has been cited by the World Bank in two employment and human capital policy reports (2025–2026), the OECD in reports on pharmaceutical market competition and access to novel medicines, the Government of Switzerland in a national health technology assessment, and the Korea Institute for Health and Social Affairs in national health system analysis.
