WHAT IS THE STUDY ABOUT?

The Living in Australia study aims to improve our understanding of what is happening in the lives of people in Australia. This is done by collecting and analysing information from thousands of families and individuals across Australia. As the study progresses, our knowledge of how Australians live and work will be greatly improved and this will help shape policy and other important decisions for our community.

Everyone's circumstances are relevant and of interest. By taking part in this study you are helping one of Australia's most important social research projects.

WHY HAVE I BEEN ASKED TO TAKE PART?

You have been asked to take part in the study because you are living in the household of someone who is participating in the research.

The study began in 2001, and the people who took part in the first year were chosen at random. For future phases of the study, anyone living in the same household as them will be asked to take part. Without having your information, we cannot gain a complete understanding of how households and family circumstances may be changing.

Your co-operation is greatly appreciated. This is your opportunity to provide policy makers and researchers with your view on life in Australia.

⊕ WHAT'S INVOLVED?

In addition, one person will also be asked to answer questions about the household in general.
